



Several major hazard organizations have been attempting to influence the organizational and safety culture at their sites to transform them into a high reliability organization (i.e., organizations that can manage and sustain almost error-free performance despite operating in hazardous conditions where the consequences of errors could be catastrophic) with a positive safety culture. In recent years there has been a huge increase in the literature talking about the control of major hazard risks, in particular the philosophies of high reliability organizations, resilience management and safety culture. At this session key features and characteristics that need to be adopted by organizations to achieve ongoing high reliability and safety objectives will be discussed.
